LAMBERT-ST. LOUIS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT NO SMOKING POLICY

A reminder to the policy distributed February 4th, 2014:

“Lambert-St. Louis International Airport and its facilities are smoke free. Smoking is only permitted in designated smoking areas that are set a minimum of 15 feet away from outside entrances. The use of electronic smoking devices is also limited to the designated smoking areas.

This policy is in accordance with the St. Louis County Clean Air Code. Violators could be subject to a citation and a fine.

Please educate your employees about this policy. Additionally, please ensure that your employees that have contact with the traveling public know to share the no smoking policy with our customers.”

Update on December 13th, 2016:

Recently, we have received tenant complaints and observed signs of smoking in: 1) the Red Level of the T1 employee garage at the base of the stairwells, inside an emergency fire stairwell, 2) on the T1 C concourse near gate C-27 through door C-2288FS, and 3) on the T1 apron level in unleased space between C-16 and C-24 through doors C-1200 and C-1162.

Please advise your employees the No Smoking Policy in all areas will be strictly enforced. Thank you!
