

## Terminal/Concourse Ramp Area Smoking Policy

### 1. Introduction

St. Louis Lambert International Airport (STL) is committed to providing a safe and healthy work environment for all users. In accordance with St. Louis County, Mo., Revised Code, Title VII, § 721.045 (1992), and motivated by City of St. Louis policy to provide a healthy work setting for all employees, the following *Terminal/Concourse Ramp Area Smoking Policy* has been adopted and shall apply to all STL users including employees, contractors and guests.

### 2. Effective Date

This policy will become effective on October 9, 2017.

### 3. Policy

#### 3.1 Definitions

“Designated Smoking Area” is a specific, approved outdoor location where smoking is permitted.

“Responsible Party” is the entity responsible for all aspects of the designated smoking area.

“Smoking” is inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or smoldering cigar, cigarette (including an electronic cigarette), pipe, or other alternative product intended for smoking, in any manner or in any form.

#### 3.2 Smoking Prohibition

1. Smoking is prohibited on the airline ramp except in designated areas as may be changed from time to time at the discretion of the Airport Deputy Director.
2. Smoking is prohibited in all interior areas of St. Louis Lambert International Airport;
3. Smoking is prohibited within 50 feet of aircraft (reference 2015 International Fire Code, Chapter 20, Section 2003);
4. Smoking is prohibited within 50 feet of aircraft fuel servicing operations, equipment fueling, flammable liquid storage, jet fuel hydrant up-takes and manifolds, explosive

atmospheres, or combustible storage (reference 2015 International Fire Code, Chapter 20, Section 2006 and 2012 National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Chapter 5, Section 5.8); and

5. Smoking is prohibited inside baggage make-up tunnels, building stairwells or exterior doorways, under any weather condition.

### 3.3 Designated Smoking Areas

Smoking is permitted in the following designated areas only:

### 3.4 Designated Areas

Designated Smoking Areas shall be clearly marked with “Smoking Allowed Here” and “Emergency Contact Number” signage and symbols. The Airport Authority will provide and maintain all signage.

Designated Smoking Areas are required to have at least one (1) fire extinguisher weighing no less than ten pounds (10 lbs.). The Responsible Party, identified above, will provide and maintain all fire extinguishers.

Designated Smoking Areas are required to have at least one (1) non-combustible, high volume, weather resistant ash receptacle for discarding all smoking materials. The Responsible Party will provide, maintain and empty all ash receptacles.

Designated Smoking Areas must be maintained litter-free. Smokers shall extinguish their cigarettes and discard them *only* in appropriate containers. Any littering of tobacco-related products is also considered a violation of this policy. The Responsible Party will monitor and maintain the designated area.

#### **4. Designating New Smoking Areas**

Airlines or tenants wishing to have a specific outdoor Ramp area designated as a smoking area may submit a request in writing to the Airport Deputy Director of Operations & Maintenance (Deputy Director). The Deputy Director will either approve or deny the request.

If the request is approved, the Airport Authority will install all required signage designating the area as a Designated Smoking Area. The airline or tenant will become the Responsible Party for the Designated Smoking Area (see Section 3.1 entitled “Definition” and Section 3.4 entitled “Designated Areas”).


If the Deputy Director of Operations & Maintenance denies the request, the denial may be appealed to the Airport Director, whose decision shall be final.

#### **5. Responsibilities & Enforcement**

The success of this policy depends upon the thoughtfulness, consideration, and cooperation of smokers and non-smokers. Responsibility for complying with this policy rests with the individual.

Persons found smoking inside STL facilities or outside of designated smoking areas are subject to a citation and fine in accordance with St. Louis County Indoor Clean Air Code.

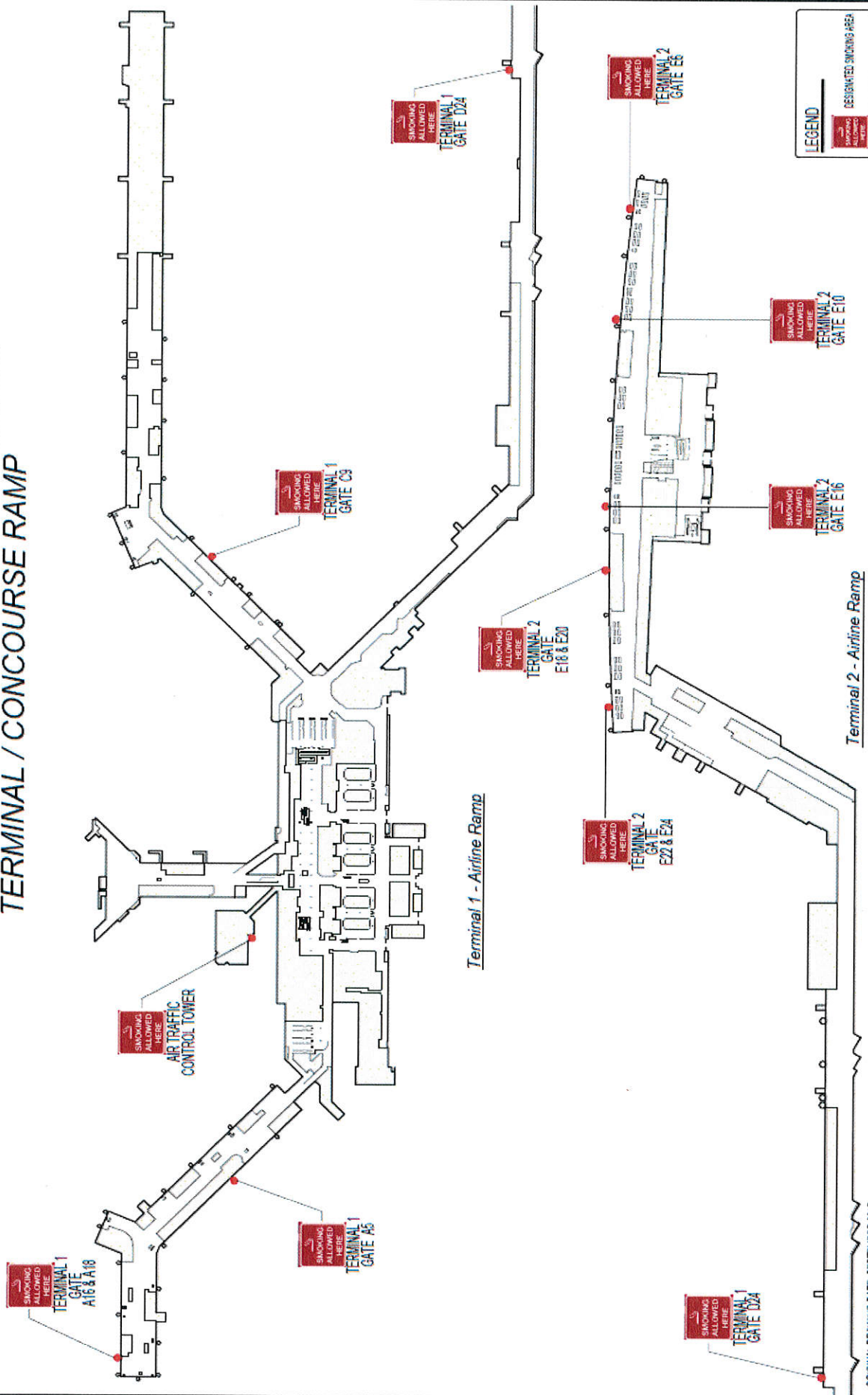
